

Granted, Liane Moriarty would be classified by most readers as a *œpop writer* • of bestsellers, but regardless, as a librarian, I believe that a well-executed story will generally make for a solid read, regardless of the target audience. Similarly, a book with a meandering plot, an overabundance of detail, and lacking a general sense of purpose will usually disappoint a majority of readers. Unfortunately, Ms. Moriartyâ™s *œTruly Madly Guilty* • falls resoundingly into the latter category, and while I went in with high hopes, itâ™s been a long time since a book disappointed me as much as *œTMG* • did. Leaving a plot synopsis to the *œbook report* • reviews, the main failing for me was Ms. Moriartyâ™s inability to generate a compelling storyline for any of the bookâ™s main characters. Yes, the friendship between Clementine and Erika was interesting enough, Clementineâ™s marriage to Sam, and Erikaâ™s to Oliver, were both engaging but never compelling, while Vid and Tiffany provided occasional welcome relief and at least helped drive the plot forward, but in general, the story that moves *œTruly Madly Guilty* • forward is very thin and sorely lacking in depth. If an author isnâ™t creating something that draws his or her audience in, something that makes the reader want to pick up the book (fiction or nonfiction) and continue reading to see how a plot will resolve, or to learn more about a topic, then there is no connection to the book and reading becomes work. For me, finishing *œTMG* • became a chore. Ms. Moriarty provides far too many details in far too many subplots, with little point and no satisfaction in the end.
